MCB is a nonprofit organized exclusively for musical, educational, and charitable purposes. Our mission is to *build community one note at a time* through active and positive encouragement to improve technique, intonation, and other musical skills... while having fun!

Who We Are

Marysville Community Band members come from all over Marysville and its surrounding neighborhoods. We are students, young adults, established professionals, and retired people. Some of us have played our instruments for only a few years; some have played for several decades. We are volunteers who come together for the sheer joy of making music.

As a community band, all of our activities (rehearsals, performances, meetings, etc) are safe spaces. **Marysville Community Band is a welcoming group that does not discriminate and does not permit discrimination or harassment** on the basis of race, ethnicity, national identity, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, disability, age, or any other such factor. Our conductor, Jordan Alexander, leads the band by choosing our music and guiding us through rehearsals to learn to play together, always striving for improvement while maintaining a fun atmosphere. He has a degree in music instruction from Central Washington University, and is the band director at 10th Street Middle School.

The Board of Directors manages the operations of the band, including concert planning, fundraising, and outreach. Directors are elected on an as-needed basis. Board meetings are open to all band members of the band; please drop in if you are interested in sharing ideas or just want to listen in. Membership Requirements, Registration & Dues

Requirements

- **Skill level.** Marysville Community Band musicians should be able to sight read music, and, with practice, play music at a Grade 3 or 4 level. This generally requires 3 years of study on the instrument, even if that was many years ago.
 - MCB does not audition its musicians. Please talk to our conductor if you are unsure of your ability to play.
- **Equipment.** All musicians must own or have access to their own instrument (some exceptions for percussion). Music stands are required for summer sessions.

Registration

- **Forms.** Forms are due from new members or if you'd like to update your information.

Dues

- **Adults**
 - Dues for the fall and spring sessions are \$25 each (\$50/year).
 - Summer session dues are \$15.
 - Pay by cash or check to our treasurer, or online at <https://givebutter.com/nmHEJ9>
 - Payment is due within two weeks of your first rehearsal date that session.
 - If payment poses financial hardship, please see a board member ASAP.
- **Youth** (under age 18)
 - No dues required: we believe there should be no barrier to youth participation.

Rehearsals & Practice

It isn't hard, it's new. Practice makes it not new.

Rehearsals

- **Attendance.** Attendance is expected at all rehearsals unless you are ill. Missing a rehearsal negatively affects other musicians and makes it difficult to balance a piece.
 - Life happens! If you know you must miss rehearsals (due to illness or otherwise) please let your section leader and the conductor know, or send email to marysvillecommunityband@gmail.com.
 - ***It is imperative that all musicians attend the final rehearsal before a concert.*** If you absolutely must miss rehearsal(s) leading up to a concert, you need to get the conductor's permission to perform.
- **Day, Time & Location.** Rehearsals are held 6-8 p.m. on Thursday evenings.
 - Fall & Spring: 10th Street Middle School band room at 7204 27th Ave NE, Tulalip.
 - Summer: Bethlehem Lutheran Church gym on the corner of 51st Ave and Grove St, Marysville. The gym is at the north end of the building.
 - Please remember that we are guests in these rehearsal spaces. We are expected to only use band-related equipment and leave these spaces clean.

Practice

As with any other band, we do expect that you will practice your parts at home. Our group rehearsal time is limited, so practicing at home is essential. If you are experiencing difficulty with a piece, please talk to your section leader or the conductor for advice or assistance.

The **Board of Directors** works for you! All MCB members are invited to the monthly Board meeting.

Concerts

We believe music is a right, not a privilege. Performances are our gift to the community.

We don't sell tickets or charge admission, but we do ask for donations at our performances; those who can afford to support the band will, and those who cannot will still be able to enjoy our music. Please invite your friends and family to our concerts!

- **Frequency.** We perform several concerts throughout the year; typically, there are 2-3 performances near the end of each session (December, May/June, and August)
 - End-of-session "official" concert.
 - Community performances: Festivals and other community events.
 - Special performances: As requested, particularly for members of our community who are physically unable to attend public events.
- **Dress.** Concert dress is generally black, accessorized for the season — i.e., red and green in December, pastels in the spring, bright/floral in summer.
- **Promotion/Publicity.** Our performances allow us to share our music, celebrate our growth as musicians, and work toward our mission to *build community one note at a time*. To that end, we want to get the word out about our concerts!
 - The Board of Directors promotes to the public via press releases, flyers, our social media channels, and our website at marysvillecommunityband.org.
 - Band members' friends and family are important guests — please invite them! To help get the word out about a performance, you can also:
 - Like our Facebook page and share the concert announcement on yours.
 - Share the flyers that the Board sends out before each event — you can share them electronically and/or print and distribute them.
 - Note: To ensure consistency of the MCB brand, all media content (visuals, text, ads, etc) must be approved by the Board of Directors.

Health & Safety

Playing wind instruments circulates airborne germs. Out of respect for your fellow musicians — who represent a wide range of well-being — please do not attend any MCB activity if you are sick. If you arrive to any activity (rehearsal, concert, etc) visibly ill, you may be asked to leave.

In the event of a public health issue about a communicable illness, the Board of Directors may enact safety precautions that align with the Snohomish County Health Department. This may include cancelling activities or requiring proof of vaccination.
